**START:** Planning a Demonstration in Frisco



Will you have 100+ people OR use public property?



**SPECIAL EVENT PERMIT**  
Frisco Special Events Office  
Fee: \$150 + \$150 late fee if <90 days



Will you use amplified sound equipment?



**NOISE CODE COMPLIANCE**  
Must comply with city noise limits  
May require permit coordination



Will you have tents >400 sq. ft., generators, or food service?



**FIRE DEPARTMENT COORDINATION**  
Contact: Frisco Fire Department



Will you need street closures or traffic control?



**POLICE COORDINATION REQUIRED**  
Included in Special Event Review  
Contact: Frisco Police Department



### NO PERMIT NEEDED

Sidewalk protests with no obstruction and no amplified sound with <100 people are generally permitted without permits, but notification to Frisco Police Department is strongly recommended for safety coordination.

### Important Reminders

- Apply at least 90 days in advance to avoid late fees (\$150 extra) - the Special Event Review Committee must decide at least 30 days before your event.
- Events with 100+ people or using public property require Special Event Permits; smaller events should still notify Frisco PD for safety coordination.
- Contact Frisco Special Events Office first at 972-292-5000 for coordination - they will determine which additional approvals are needed from Police and Fire departments.
