	<p><b>Margaret Hunt Hill Bridge – Dallas</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>📍 1800 Margaret Hunt Hill Bridge, Dallas, TX 75207</li><li>• Iconic cable-stayed bridge designed by Spanish architect Santiago Calatrava, spanning the Trinity River and connecting downtown Dallas to West Dallas.</li><li>• One of the city's most photographed landmarks, offering dramatic skyline views and serving as a symbol of modern Dallas.</li></ul>
	<p><b>Main Street Garden Park – Dallas</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>📍 1902 Main St, Dallas, TX 75201</li><li>• Five-acre urban park in the heart of downtown featuring open lawns, public art, a dog park, playground, and event space.</li><li>• Popular gathering place for festivals, community events, and visitors exploring downtown Dallas.</li></ul>

	<p><b>Fair Park – Dallas (FIFA Fan Festival™ Dallas Venue)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>3809 Grand Ave, Dallas, TX 75210</li> <li>Historic 277-acre cultural campus featuring Art Deco architecture, museums, performance venues, and event spaces.</li> <li>Home of the State Fair of Texas and the FIFA Fan Festival™ Dallas during the FIFA World Cup 2026™.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Halperin Park – South Dallas</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1700 Robert B Cullum Blvd, Dallas, TX 75210</li> <li>Expansive green space adjacent to Fair Park offering walking trails, open lawns, and community gathering areas.</li> <li>Provides a welcoming gateway between surrounding neighborhoods and the Fair Park campus.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza – Dallas</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>411 Elm St, Dallas, TX 75202</li> <li>Signature historic site focused on President Kennedy’s life, assassination, and legacy in the former Texas School Book Depository.</li> <li>Combines museum-quality curation with the gravity of an on-site location overlooking Dealey Plaza.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Reunion Tower GeO-Deck – Dallas</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>300 Reunion Blvd E, Dallas, TX 75207</li> <li>Iconic lit "ball" on the skyline with 360-degree views, interactive displays, and a strong first-timer wow factor.</li> <li>Especially popular around sunset and at night for city and Trinity River corridor views.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Dallas Arboretum &amp; Botanical Garden – East Dallas / White Rock Lake</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>8525 Garland Rd, Dallas, TX 75218</li> <li>Lakeside gardens known for large-scale seasonal festivals, floral displays, pumpkin village, and holiday programming.</li> <li>Functions as both a marquee attraction and premium event venue on White Rock Lake.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Dallas World Aquarium – Downtown Dallas</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1801 N Griffin St, Dallas, TX 75202</li> <li>Indoor aquarium plus rainforest-style habitats, birds, and marine life, making it a top family attraction downtown.</li> <li>Serves as an all-weather, year-round draw a short walk from other city-center sites.</li> </ul>

	<p><b>Klyde Warren Park &amp; Dallas Arts District – Central Dallas</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>📍 2012 Woodall Rodgers Fwy, Dallas, TX 75201</li> <li>• Deck park over Woodall Rodgers linking Uptown and downtown, activated with food trucks, free programs, and skyline sightlines.</li> <li>• Immediately adjacent to the Dallas Museum of Art, Nasher Sculpture Center, and Crow Museum of Asian Art, creating a dense cultural zone.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Dallas Zoo – South Dallas</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>📍 650 S R L Thornton Fwy, Dallas, TX 75203</li> <li>• Largest and oldest zoo in Texas with signature habitats like Giants of the Savanna and robust education programming.</li> <li>• Big family draw with easy access from downtown and I-35.</li> </ul>

	<p><b>Texan Golden Boot – Arlington</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>📍 708 Stadium Dr E, Arlington, TX 76011</li> <li>• Permanent public art landmark by the North Texas Sports Foundation that fuses fútbol's iconic Golden Boot with a Texas Spur, symbolizing the connection between the world's game and North Texas heritage. Created from locally sourced reclaimed metal by internationally recognized sculptor Steve Ekpenisi.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Linear Park – Arlington</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>📍 1050 Ballpark Way, Arlington, TX 76011 (central reference point)</li> <li>• Multi-use park and trail corridor connecting key destinations within Arlington's Entertainment District.</li> <li>• Provides pedestrian-friendly access between major attractions including AT&amp;T Stadium, Globe Life Field, and surrounding entertainment venues.</li> </ul>
